Money Laundering and Proceeds of Crime in Fraud and Anti-counterfeiting Cases

This session focuses on the money trail, including what tips and tricks you can use to help spot money laundering. The Financial Transactions and Reports Analysis Centre of Canada (FINTRAC) is Canada's financial intelligence unit. Its mandate is to facilitate the detection, prevention and deterrence of money laundering and the financing of terrorist activities, while ensuring the protection of personal information under its control. Topics to be covered include an overview of FINTRAC, types of reports received and what is included in a FINTRAC disclosure.

The Guardia di Finanza is the Italian law enforcement agency, that deals with tax crimes, public spending fraud, counterfeiting, smuggling, illicit trade, money laundering and terrorism financing. The Corps is a unique and modern organization able to investigate, at the same time, the violations to the national and European budget and the pervasive threat of the organized crime to the legitimate economy.
